

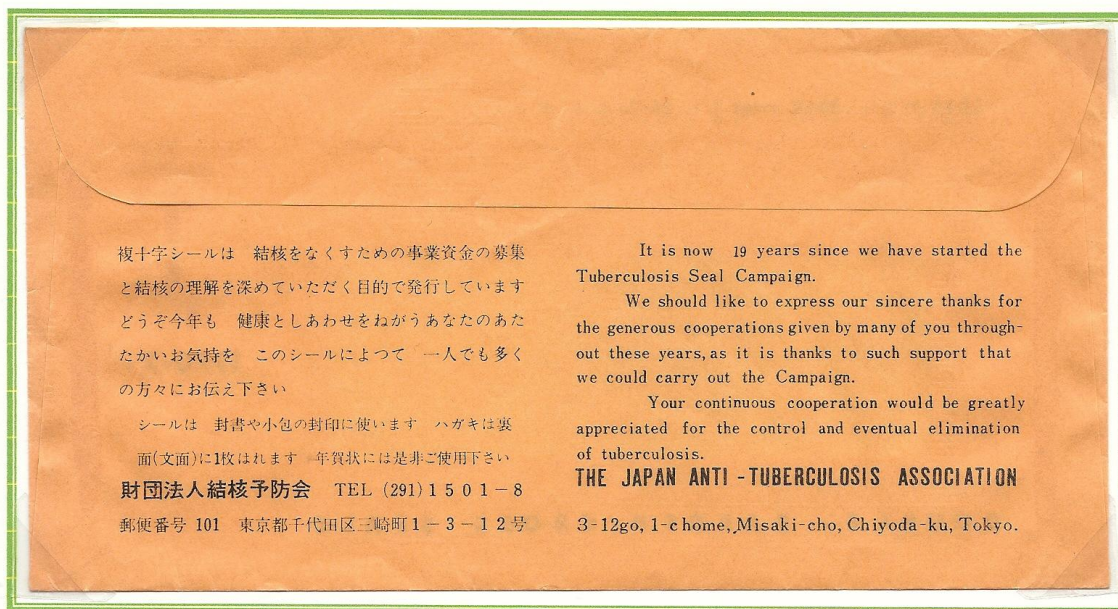
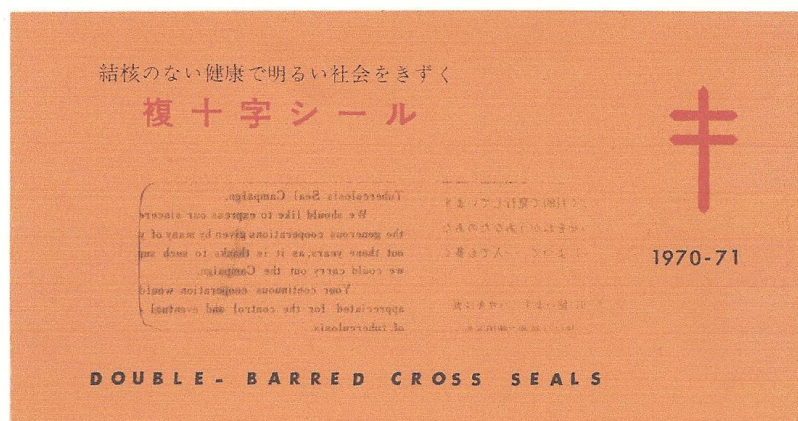
The Double Barred Cross Seals of Japan

Japan issued there first Tuberculosis seals on 1st November 1952 and continued to issue them until September 1974.

The Japanese call the cross of Loraine a double barred cross and this was the name adopted by the Japan Anti-Tuberculosis Association.

The funds raised were for the control and eventual elimination of the lung disease Tuberculosis.

This display shows the Seals, Miniature Sheets, Blocks, some sheets related material sold by the Japan Anti-Tuberculosis Association, who where based in Tokyo.

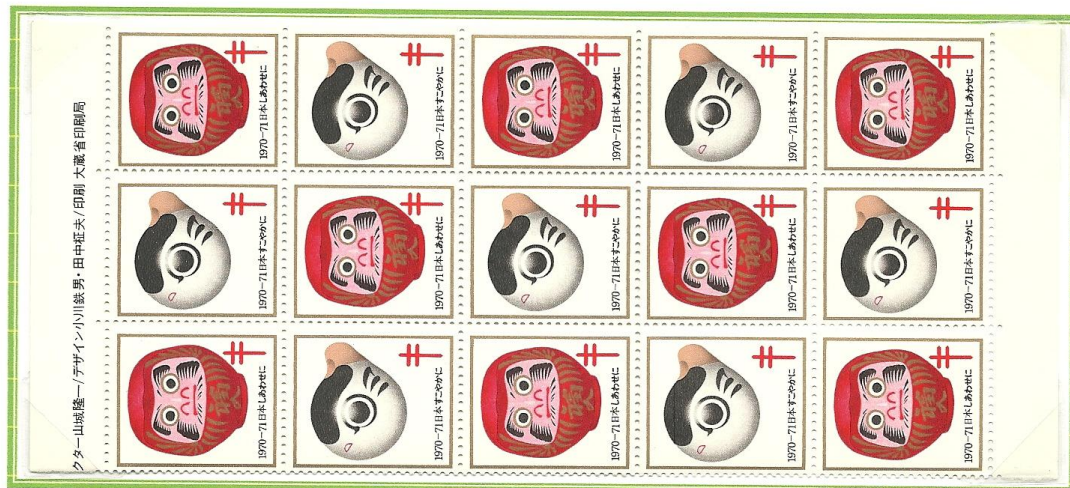
1969
